

BY-LAW NO. 2023-06
COMMUNITY OF THREE RIVERS MUNICIPAL BY-LAW
DESIGNATING PORTIONS OF ROADS TO BE ACCESSIBLE TO
OFF-ROAD VEHICLES

Under the powers granted by the *Off-Road Vehicle Act, S.N.B. 1985, c.-O-1.5 and its amendments*, the Council of The Community of Three Rivers duly assembled enacts as follows:

Definitions:

In the present by-law

1. *Off-road vehicle* means all vehicles included in the definition of off-road vehicle as defined in the aforementioned *Off-Road Vehicle Act*, with the exception of amphibious vehicles.

General Provisions:

2. No person shall drive an off-road vehicle on any streets or roads other than at locations designated for this purpose as further set out below on maps attached to this by-law as Schedules A to C.
3. The driver or any occupant of the off-road vehicle must be properly wearing a helmet that complies with the standards prescribed by Regulations under the Motor Vehicle Act.
4. The off-road vehicle must be outfitted with the necessary equipment as described in accordance with the *Off-Road Vehicle Act*.
5. Off-Road Vehicles shall display a valid trail permit as required under the Off-Road Vehicle Act or a valid trail permit from another Province having a reciprocal agreement with New Brunswick, this license being in the form of a sticker which must be clearly and permanently displayed on the ATV or Side-by-Side. The driver must be immediately able to provide a registration document and an insurance document for the vehicle. A license plate with a valid sticker must be visible.
6. Off-road vehicles must travel in the same direction as traffic and shall move in single file on the far right of the street at a speed not exceeding 40km/h.

7. Off-road vehicles shall give the appropriate signals as required under the *Motor Vehicle Act* and obey all traffic control devices.
8. No person shall operate an Off-Road Vehicle on the travelled portion of Schedules A, B, or C unless they are in possession of a valid driver's license.
9. Any other vehicle utilizing the street shall have the right of way.
10. No person shall operate an Off-Road Vehicle in such a way as to disrupt or destroy the natural environment, create a nuisance by method or frequency of operation on any municipal property or upon any highway within the municipality.

11. As set out in Schedule A:

Off-road vehicles may be driven the full length of Maple Street, Petitcodiac

Off-road vehicles may be driven on Pollett River Rd from Maple St to Hooper Lane

Off-road vehicles may be driven the full length of Hooper Lane, Petitcodiac

12. As set out in Schedule B:

Off-road vehicles may be driven on Railway Ave., Petitcodiac from Route 106 to trail 3301.

13. As set out in Schedule C:

Off-road vehicles may be driven on Main St Petitcodiac from Route 106 (Old Post Road) to Civic # 50 to allow access to downtown amenities.

14. No person shall drive an off-road vehicle on a street or road that is not identified in this by-law.

Offences:

15. Anyone who violates this by-law is guilty of a punishable offence, and liable on conviction to a fine of \$100, in addition to any fine under the *Off-Road Vehicle Act, SNB 1985, c 0-1.5 and its amendments*.

Adoption:

The present By-Law will take effect upon its adoption.

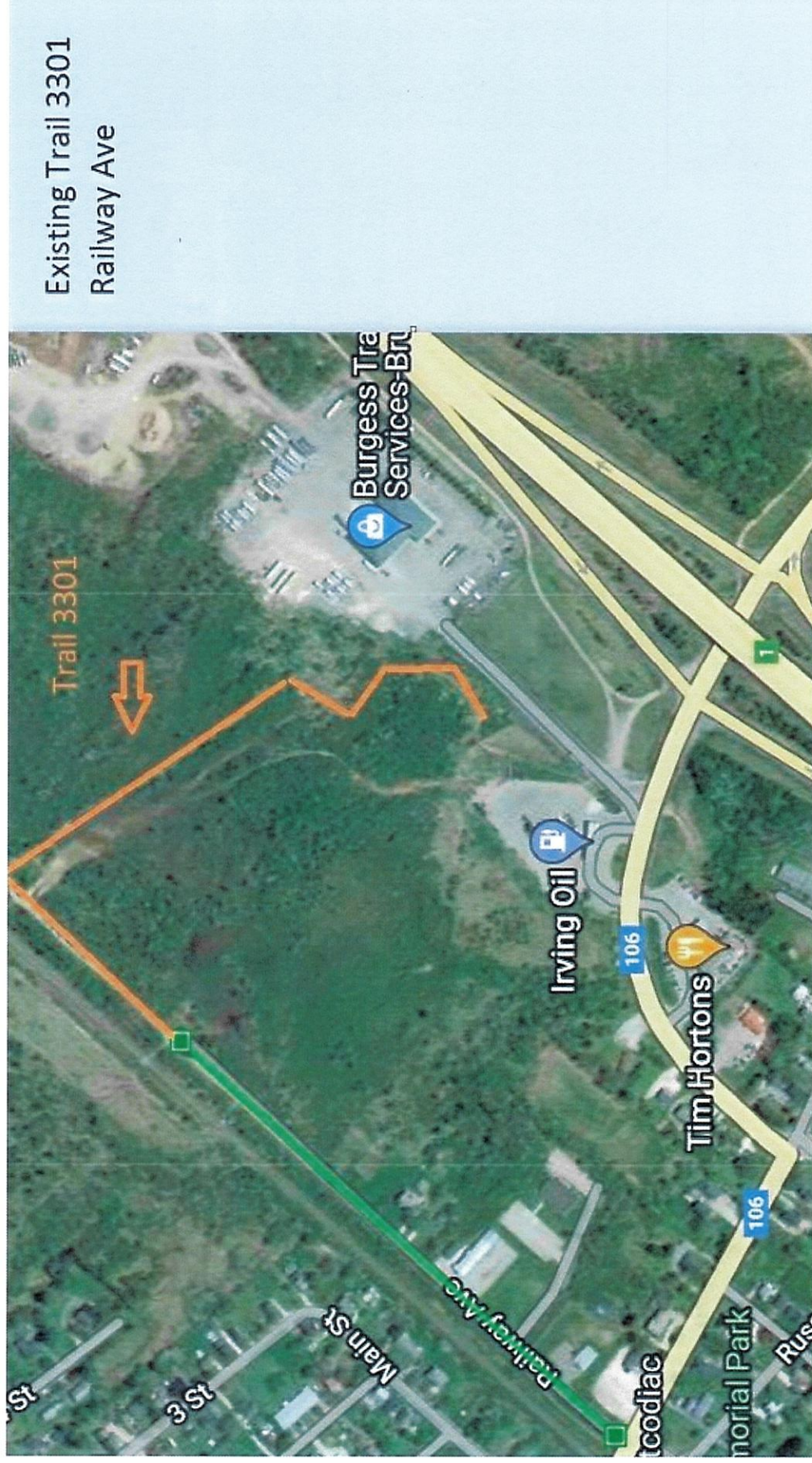
